1.1 Documentation

The full documentation is at <https://django-grpc-framework.readthedocs.io>.

1.2 Quickstart

Install `django-grpc-framework`:

```
pip install django-grpc-framework
```

Add it to your `INSTALLED_APPS`:

```
INSTALLED_APPS = [  
    ...  
    'grpc_framework',  
]
```

Create your grpc app:

```
python manage.py grpcstartapp <app_name>
```

Define your proto in <app_name>/<app_name>.proto.

Add your app to GRPC_APPS:

```
GRPC_APPS = [  
    '<app_name>',  
]
```

Generate protocol buffer compiler:

```
python manage.py grpcgenerate
```

Create your service in <app_name>/service.py.

Start a grpc server with your apps:

```
python manage.py grpcrunserver
```

```
source <YOURVIRTUALENV>/bin/activate  
(myenv) $ pip install tox  
(myenv) $ tox
```


CHAPTER 2

Installation

At the command line:

```
$ easy_install django-grpc-framework
```

Or, if you have virtualenvwrapper installed:

```
$ mkvirtualenv django-grpc-framework  
$ pip install django-grpc-framework
```


3.1 Interceptors

Add interceptor to GRPC_FRAMEWORK like this:

```
GRPC_FRAMEWORK = {
    'INTERCEPTORS': [
        ('grpc_framework.interceptors.log.LoggerInterceptor', {}),
    ]
}
```

Grpc_framework provides log and header interceptor, you can define it yourself, then add it.

3.2 Credentials

You can start a ssl server by command:

```
python manage.py runserver --certificate_chain_pairs=server.crt,server.key
```

3.3 Signals

Grpc_framework provides signals:

- `grpc_framework.signals.grpc_server_init`
- `grpc_framework.signals.grpc_server_started`
- `grpc_framework.signals.grpc_server_shutdown`
- `grpc_framework.signals.grpc_request_started`
- `grpc_framework.signals.grpc_request_exception`

- `grpc_framework.signals.grpc_request_finished`

3.4 Logs

Grpc_framework provides default log interceptor, you can set your own LOGGING:

```
[2020-02-24 07:29:06,271] /RouteGuide/RouteChat success 0
```

3.5 Important

You can't rename any files by executing this command:

```
python manage.py grpcstartapp <app_name>
```

4.1 Types of Contributions

4.1.1 Report Bugs

Report bugs at <https://github.com/itswcg/django-grpc-framework/issues>.

If you are reporting a bug, please include:

- Your operating system name and version.
- Any details about your local setup that might be helpful in troubleshooting.
- Detailed steps to reproduce the bug.

4.1.2 Fix Bugs

Look through the GitHub issues for bugs. Anything tagged with “bug” is open to whoever wants to implement it.

4.1.3 Implement Features

Look through the GitHub issues for features. Anything tagged with “feature” is open to whoever wants to implement it.

4.1.4 Write Documentation

django-grpc-framework could always use more documentation, whether as part of the official django-grpc-framework docs, in docstrings, or even on the web in blog posts, articles, and such.

4.1.5 Submit Feedback

The best way to send feedback is to file an issue at <https://github.com/itswcg/django-grpc-framework/issues>.

If you are proposing a feature:

- Explain in detail how it would work.
- Keep the scope as narrow as possible, to make it easier to implement.
- Remember that this is a volunteer-driven project, and that contributions are welcome :)

4.2 Get Started!

Ready to contribute? Here's how to set up *django-grpc-framework* for local development.

1. Fork the *django-grpc-framework* repo on GitHub.
2. Clone your fork locally:

```
$ git clone git@github.com:your_name_here/django-grpc-framework.git
```

3. Install your local copy into a virtualenv. Assuming you have virtualenvwrapper installed, this is how you set up your fork for local development:

```
$ mkvirtualenv django-grpc-framework
$ cd django-grpc-framework/
$ python setup.py develop
```

4. Create a branch for local development:

```
$ git checkout -b name-of-your-bugfix-or-feature
```

Now you can make your changes locally.

5. When you're done making changes, check that your changes pass flake8 and the tests, including testing other Python versions with tox:

```
$ flake8 grpc_framework tests
$ python setup.py test
$ tox
```

To get flake8 and tox, just pip install them into your virtualenv.

6. Commit your changes and push your branch to GitHub:

```
$ git add .
$ git commit -m "Your detailed description of your changes."
$ git push origin name-of-your-bugfix-or-feature
```

7. Submit a pull request through the GitHub website.

4.3 Pull Request Guidelines

Before you submit a pull request, check that it meets these guidelines:

1. The pull request should include tests.
2. If the pull request adds functionality, the docs should be updated. Put your new functionality into a function with a docstring, and add the feature to the list in README.rst.
3. The pull request should work for Python 2.6, 2.7, and 3.3, and for PyPy. Check https://travis-ci.org/itswgcg/django-grpc-framework/pull_requests and make sure that the tests pass for all supported Python versions.

4.4 Tips

To run a subset of tests:

```
$ python -m unittest tests.test_grpc_framework
```
